

Many examples show these characteristics, all of which came into play in the School of Virtue, proving Palau to be a leader with all the above mentioned traits and dimensions.

The School of Virtue was Francis's response to the circumstances of his time, to the challenge posed by the infiltration of atheism amongst a traditionally Catholic people. Organized into cycles of systematic studies, it covered a whole year, the 52 Sundays of the liturgical calendar. Each study session delivered basic Christian doctrine, within a concrete and well-structured program that left no room for digressions or unforeseen events.

In his leadership style Francisco was able to connect values and proposals, passion and imagination, all needed to mobilize and to encourage those who participated in his projects. May we imitate Father Palau in at least some of his characteristics, in order to continue to bring life to his work for the Church, God and our neighbours.

"The wonderful thing about Sister Teresa was her immense simplicity. her unassuming humility and her boundless charity. Her great heart knew no resentment or envy or jealousy. or other human passions, but

only love and kindness given to all who approached her" (The Power of Witness, p. 13).

Salvation, like health, holiness and life, is not a state but a journey. It is a journey accompanied by the unconditional love that inspires us to see an opportunity for healing in every wound, to experience a shared joy in every happy experience, and to hear a call to action and trust in every injustice.

«We must trust in the Lord, for not a leaf moves on a tree unless it is His will" (Summ PO, p. 23-19). From her I learned to say, «Lord, in all things, your holy will» (Positio, p. 76).

## **PLACES TO ENCOUNTER** FRANCISCO PALAU: THE CAVE AND HIS **BIRTHPLACE**

As we enter these places of encounter with Francisco Palau, we recall one of his sayings: "Enter into the depths of the temple of your soul; remain there in silence and listen to the voice of God, who always speaks to you from deep down in your heart" (Letter 1).

We have received in these Palautian sites religious congregations and sisters from our congregation, families and groups of children from our schools and from the parish community. Various groups were also able to participate in retreats, meetings, prayers, silence, contemplation, confession, fellowship, spiritual exercises, and eucharistic celebrations.

During their stay, they were able to enjoy both the silence which leads into prayer and personal encounter with the Lord, and the beauty of nature that leads us to contemplate the beauty created by God and to contemplate Him through that beauty: "O forests and thickets, planted by the hand of the beloved!" (Spiritual Canticle of St. John of the Cross) Through reflection, dialogue, and fellowship, they have also had opportunities to perceive the presence of God that creates communion and fraternity.

On the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, a special encounter takes place during a procession where the statue of the Virgin Mary is carried to a cave. There, in front of her image, the Eucharist is celebrated, with a blessing and imposition of scapulars for the families who request it.

On November 7th, the solemnity of our founding father is celebrated in the cave. This refers to the liturgical feast of Blessed Francisco Palau y Quer,



a Discalced Carmelite priest., with the participation of faithful from the town and the Little Sisters of the Abandoned Elderly. This usually ends with refreshments offered by the community.

These encounters are not limited exclusively to the cave. On the 29th of every month, the community opens the doors of the house where Father Palau was born for an experience of Palautian prayer, attended by young people and families from the village.

Thus, the birthplace and the cave continue to be a places of attraction where the Church awaits everyone.
