Entering into dialogue with ourselves, the questions arise: Am I doing what I am expected to do in the world? Am I hungry and thirsty for holiness, or am I resigning myself to mediocrity?

Love has only one rule:

give everything, "if you listen to the voice of the Lord today, do not harden your hearts" (Heb.3:7-8).

Growing in holiness will consist of freely consenting to the Lord introducing us into the depths, always mysterious, of our personal encounter with Him, until we reach perfect faceto-face contemplation with God.

The pinnacle of the Christian life is feeling filled with the fullness of God. Great paradox: To be filled with the one who fills, embraces and overflows everything.

The letters as a whole, among other themes, inform us about the spiritual process of Francis and the Palautian charism, hence its importance. They illustrate his life from **34 to 60 years** of age approximately. They are addressed to diverse people and respond to a variety of circumstances.

On this occasion, we will stop at letters **37 to 42** where Francisco explains how charity works in us to bring us into communion with the Church through what he calls "The Operations of Charity".

These letters, rich in spirituality, are addressed to Juana Gracias and written the year 1857. In them, Francisco explains how love through two operations leads the person to union with the Church. Essential in this process of humanization is, as he points out, the search for God's will, abandonment into his hands, prayer, and spiritual

accompaniment, examination of conscience, silence and humility.

In the life of prayer, he invites us to turn our gaze to Jesus Crucified in his Mystical Body. The gaze does not stop only at the **CRUCIFIED**, it goes further, it invites us to contemplate the pain of humanity, that is, to contemplate all the crucified of the earth. Thus is the style of Palautian prayer that embraces the whole Mystery as subject and object, the mystery of God and the brother.

"Charity has two acts; it breaks into the soul in two operations: first, it unites the soul with God. Second, united with God, he dedicates it to the good of his neighbors. First operation: this consists in your will being in all things, in actions, in thoughts and words, according to God's, so that you are not the one who wants or does not want but God in you, God with you and God for you... "

## TERESA MIRA: And her little babies

Alcalá de Chivert (September 1918-September 1924) Sister Teresa began her mission as a nursery teacher in Alcalá de Chivert (Castellón-Spain). There the congregation had a college. The sister arrived very weak because she had just passed a double pneumonia. She was the youngest in the community and was considered the most suitable to take charge of the children's class. Teresa's heart jumped with joy because she carried this vocation in her soul.

The mothers began to arrive with their little ones, most did not know how to walk and Teresa carried them in her arms at times some and sometimes others. She placed them all under the protection of the Guardian Angel and the Infant Jesus of Prague. She always relied on the power of prayer.

The classroom was not very large, but it welcomed more than 60 little angels as Teresa called them. It overlooked a small chapel that Teresa opened and began to pray and sing to the Child Jesus, to the Virgin Mary. Her little angels with their joined hands ... The sister's face was filled with joy. Here she was weaving her motto: do good to all.

Moms and children took a great affection for her. They noticed something special in her; the mantle of charity with which she covered everything, always accompanied by her usual smile.

She spent six years sowing in Alcalá testimony of prayer, faithful in service, and teaching with life... Then came time for transfer to another community. The station of Alcalá was an anthill of children, young people and adults.

The fame of holiness she left remains an attraction for many people who continue to turn to her intercession.

«My dear Adelia, Matilde and Sofia: I received your letter, I am very grateful for your prayers and I already know how much you all love me, so I do not doubt that you will pray for me to the Lord, and also if I die, from Heaven I will pray a lot for you because you have always given us many proofs of affection and if I did not reciprocate I would be ungrateful... »

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### LET US NOT FORGET THE MARTYRS

for PASTOR MIRALLES. Josefa, Tertiary Carmelite Brothers, Ed. CMT, 1998, 203-204

On this occasion, we will dedicate this space to remember Blessed Bonaventure Toldrá Rodón beatified, by virtue of martyrdom, on October 13, 2013.

Born in Pla de Cabra, today Pla de Santa María (Tarragona). He was born on 31-03-1896, son of Antonio and Teresa, farmers. Baptized the same day with the names of Bonaventure, Andrew, Raymond. He entered the Institute of Carmelite Brothers of Teaching at the age of 19, in July 1915, from the pontifical seminary of Tarragona.

He made his temporary profession in Tarragona on 01-01-1917 and the following year he was sent to El Vendrell, where he remained for about three years. He returned to Tarragona and taught at the Tarraconense School. The preparation of Br. Bonaventure was good and he is described as "professor" while the other Brothers are classified as "teacher" or "assistant".

In Tarragona, July 1936, he was surprised by the events of the Spanish Civil War. On the 21st, he took refuge with his confreres in his parents' house in the C / Nuestra Señora Del Claustro, where his brother priest was too. Four days later, they were discovered. Brother Bonaventure, in bidding farewell to her mother, who in anguish contemplated the arrest of the Carmelites, told her: "All this, mother, is religious persecution; let all be for Our Lord. If we don't see each other here anymore, it will be in Heaven." Young Toldrá sensed that it was the definitive separation from his mother here on earth. After the imprisonment of 4 months on the prison ship "Río Segre", he would end up shot on the wall of the cemetery of Torredembarra with his Brothers and a group of priests, religious and laity of Tarragona.
