Resuming this simple publication, "Hoja Palautiana";, brings to my memory the congregational magazine Rocío Carmelitano that began its journey in 1929. Its objective is to be a bond of union, to share pastoral criteria and "to make known the founder Francisco Palau in two directions: internal enculturation and propagation of his figure, life and writings, to radiate his devotion and pave the way his prompt beatification" (History of the Congregation CMT III-1, 27). I cannot imagine what those sisters of the thirties would do if they had the means we have today! Much later emerges, among several publications dedicated to our founder, this simple, informative sheet where there is room to excite with the captivating and prophetic features of Fr. Palau and the simplicity of Sr. Teresa Mira, and where testimonies of graces received through their intercession are shared. With my words I would like to pay homage and express the gratitude of the Congregation to the sisters who for years made possible its publication and dissemination. Today, after an impasse, it returns to our hands and awaits your collaboration to be, with a new face and new languages, what our first sisters already sensed, a space for the dissemination of holiness of life and the dissemination of the spirituality of communion so necessary in this time.

Holiness in the Church

Holiness, without being an exclusive reality of our Church, is still a call addressed to all of us (Lev 11:45). Each of us must discern our path and bring out the best of ourselves as so many other brothers and sisters have done. The recognition of holiness in the **Catholic Church** comes after a long process of investigation into the lives of the people involved. There are four ways to do this:

- 1. The way of heroic virtues.
- 2. The way of martyrdom.
- 3. The path of exceptional causes, confirmed by ancient worship and written sources, also called "beatification equivalent canonization".
- 4. The way of offering life, proposed in the motu proprio **Maiorem hac dilectionem**.

In the case of Blessed Francis-

co Palau and Venerable Teresa Mira, their process began from the path of heroic virtues, while the blessed Carmelites Brothers of teaching did so from the path of martyrdom.

Today for the church to declare the sanctify of Blessed Francis co Palau and the martyred brothers there is a need of a miracle throught their intercesseion.



Francisco Palau y Quer: A gift for the Church

Reading the writings of Francisco Palau should be a pleasant moment for all those who call ourselves spiritual children of Francisco Palau. There are many topics that we find in them; it is enough to look at their pages to realize it.

You may wonder where to begin to come into contact with Francis' writings and from what perspective. The most widely read texts, we could well say, are the Month of Mary and the Letters. Then follow other writings for some of difficult reading, as is the case of My Relationships where the queen is the symbolism that weaves her literary style.

To begin or start again, I suggest a rather **sapiential**, reading, that is, a reading that allows you to savor and achieve a greater understanding of the person of Francis; A reading that can awake or revitalize in you the filial relationship with him and that can lead you to an encounter in which you can perceive the beating of his ecclesial heart. You can begin with one of his letters in which he talks about the theological virtues, which are the friends we need to go forward in the

itinerary of conversion to the Church. The

experience of these virtues; Faith, hope and love propitiate in us the necessary changes and lead us to total communion with the Church, understood as God and humanity, hence its importance.

Suggested texts: **Letters 37, 38, 67, 74, 81 and 88.**

First, read the letter literally, then place it in context, that is, ask yourself and try to answer:

What was happening in the life of Francis when he wrote this text?

Whom does he write to?

How does he express himself?

What draws your attention?

Once this step is finished; go to another step and let you be questioned and affected by the text and ask yourself:

What does this reading invite me to?

Teresa Mira: a silent smile

Sister Teresa Mira was born on September 26, 1895 in Algueña-Alicante, Spain. She joined the Congregation in 1915, professed in 1916, pronounced her perpetual vows in 1921. She lived devoted to the Church until her death on February 26, 1941.

On December 17, 1996, the Holy Father John Paul II with his signature promulgated the Decree in which he officially declared her Venerable, recognizing her heroic virtues. Our Teresa is a figure who speaks to us of humility, strength, equanimity and so many other virtues that she was working on in her life. This is what Sr. Amparo Comas Ruíz CMT, who died in May 2021, in a prayer wrote to Sister Teresa Mira. Prayer that tells us about her sororal relationship with her:

"Sr. Teresa teach me to smile, let nothing and no one disturb the peace of my heart. Let me learn like you, Sr. Teresa, to live in humility. You know this cost. The smile always seen with a heart at peace with God and our brothers and sisters. Where have you learnt Sr. Teresa so many qualities if not in your intimate dealings with God in Prayer? I would dare to say that your life was this living in God and for God and through God the love of the brothers. How nice it is to say it! However, Sister Teresa, you lived it, so why don't I do it? Give me a hand, because your sister I am, what you did we can do. We need souls dedicated to love, to that love with a capital letter, souls given like you to the good of souls with generous charity, with a humble attitude and a constant smile ..."

Following the example of Sister Amparo, may we too cultivate friendship with Venerable Sr. Teresa Mira.

Let Us Not Forget the Martyrs

The Carmelite teaching Brothers died on 11 November 1936, they are one of the 522 martyrs of the Church of Tarragona; and were beatified on 13th october 2013.

Sometimes it seems that we forget the Palautian martyrs. Moreover, it should really be noted that they represent an enormous pain for our family, both because of their bloody death and because with them the possibility of a particular experience of our charism dies. However, at the same time, they are a strong testimony of how far the total surrender to love goes, because without having harmed anyone they were persecuted and shot simply for their faith.

Luís Domingo, Julio, Buenaventura and Isidro represent all categories of the Spanish people, each in the particularity of their lives. And these are just a few of our brothers because, as a result of the spanish civil war, the Carmelite Teaching Brothers' branch disappeared. As a result of the above, there are more martyred brothers, but they have not yet been recognised for their martyrdom.

Among looting, burning of churches and convents, violence against bishops, priests and religious, expropriation of ecclesiastical properties, seclusion of all religious activities within churches, limitation and total control of religious orders, their activities and any public manifestation of the Catholic faith, it seems that these sons of Palau were called to share in their lives the same persecutions that their founder had faced in his time. Just for this, and for many more things that time and space do not allow us to recount, let us not forget the Martyrs.
